Reach For The Sky!

Students will learn how to safely climb into the canopy of a huge oak tree giving far-reaching views across the Solent back to the mainland.

Sessions are delivered by mature instructors who encourage independent learning, foster a sense of self-belief and teach responsible risk management in a fun and safe environment.

All safety equipment is provided, along with expert instruction.

We love the fact that it's not always the children that usually excel at sports that achieve the most during this activity...

Location

Climbing takes place in Appley Park, just off the pedestrian esplanade alongside Ryde's golden sandy beaches.

The park is bordered by trees but there is easy access to public toilets, cafes, a play park and the beach.

Waiting Time Activities

For reasons of supervision ratios, only 12 climbers are allowed per session. It is sometimes possible to run more than one session concurrently on different trees within the park.

If there is any wait time though, the non-climbing groups can utilise the local public facilities or else Goodleaf can provide outdoor games for use on the park. Our own educational resources plus an orienteering sheet can help keep them busy!

For very large groups we can arrange to split the day with another off-site activity and swap over at lunchtime.
