Romano-British Farmhouse

Newport Roman Villa houses the remains of a Romano-British farmhouse constructed in 280AD and rediscovered in 1926 when the owners of a nearby house sank foundations for a new garage!

Subsequent excavations revealed extensive remains of a well-preserved farmhouse providing a fascinating insight into country life in third century Britain.

Hypocaust System

The Romans were fine engineers and designers and this is reflected in the remains of the villa, much of which is still in excellent condition.

The hypocaust system graphically displays the famed Roman central heating and the villa also has the remains of a Roman bath which is also in very good condition.

The restoration team has painstakingly recreated scenes within the villa, and outside by creating a Roman herb garden as it would have been nearly 2000 years ago.
