Award-winning Visitor Centre

Brading Roman Villa's award-winning visitor centre and museum offers a unique insight into Roman life in Britain, from beautifully-preserved mosaic floors to an extensive collection of Roman archaeology.

School groups booking through Education Destination will be allocated a dedicated tour guide for the duration of their visit, and students can access additional craft-based activities after the tour such as making a mosaic coaster to take away with them.

Preservation

The museum preserves the West Range, built around AD300, which is the last and grandest of three buildings on the site.

The foundations of two earlier North and South ranges are now outlined in chalk outside. The South Range was erected in around AD100, not long after the Roman invasion of Britain in AD43, and was followed by the completion of the grander North Range around AD200.

Since its rediscovery the villa and surrounding land have been excavated many times. Using artefacts and archaeological reports, the museum will take you on a tour from prehistory up to the modern day.

The West Range was a high status house, providing separate private living accommodation for the owner and their family together with space for entertaining guests.

The cover building was erected in 2004.
