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Lovely Sand & Shingle Beach

Totland Bay is a picturesque sand and shingle beach which is ideal for paddling and swimming, with clear turquoise waters and far reaching views to the mainland.

The bay is located on the west side of the Isle of Wight, close to the village of Totland and not too far from the Needles, which can be observed from a distance.

The beach has a number of groynes along its sandy shores, backing onto a sea wall where the sand turns to pebbles.

The coastline here is rocky yet for the most part covered in a thick blanket of trees and greenery.

The beach is accessed via a narrow lane, unsuitable for large vehicles. So expect a 5-minute walk if arriving by coach!

Along the Seawall

The seawall itself makes for a pleasant walk, and along its length you'll find public toilets, cafes and pubs.

An old Victorian wood and iron pier, 140m in length, is currently being restored and will eventually form an extension of one of the popular local cafes.
