About this activity

The task links to specific skills in English that will be engaging and relevant to students in upper key stage 2, as it challenges them to compose and perform a drama piece in the form of a news report.

Prior to their visit to Blackgang Chine, students will have investigated the conventions of script-writing in class. They will have researched stereotypical features of cowboys and perhaps done a more in-depth study of notorious cowboys in history.

They will be given the tack of writing a TV news report about

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class, and research notorious cowboys in history.

They then write a news report about a robbery at Blackgang's Cowboy Town, and will film a re-enactment of the robbery at the park, before editing their news report back at school.

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complete their script (which uses characters such as newsreaders, correspondents, cowboys/girls and a bank teller).

They will then film the final part of the news report back at school and incorporate the filming which they undertook at Blackgang Chine.

Questions & Answers

What is the task?


This is a writing and performance task which enables children to practise their planning, writing and performance skills. Students will also use technology to film and edit their work and will develop their skills of collaboration when producing their outcome.

How does this link to my child's learning?

▶ Pupils will be writing for a specific purpose and audience; they will practise using formal and informal language which is scene-appropriate. In addition to developing their performance skills, ICT skills will also be extended due to the need to film and edit their final report. They will also use their skills of evauation when providing feedback to other groups.

What will they learn?

- They will learn the conventions of script writing.
- ► They will understand the structure of TV News reports and how language is used appropriately in the different scenes of the task.
- ► They will develop their collaborative skills throughout the making of their report.

How does this enrich study undertaken in school?

- ▶ This resource enables students to put their writing skills into a real-life context.
- ➤ The task will enable them to practise their writing skills, using appropriate language features.
- ▶ It will also build on students' speaking and listening skills and support their work in ICT.

What do they need to have done in preparation?

It is suggested that script-writing skills are studied in class before the visit so that the bank robbery scene can be written prior to arrival at Cowboy Town. This will ensure that students are ready to film when they arrive on-site.

What skills do they need to demonstrate?

- Writing for a purpose and audience.
- ► Performance skills.
- Choosing language for effect.
