Contextual Summary

This is a post-visit English writing resource (with some on-site preparation) that engages students with their visit to Blackgang Chine Theme Park. The resource tasks enable them to practise their researching, recording, crafting and composition skills.

Students are asked to write to inform, using their experiences at Blackgang Chine as their stimulus material. The task links to Restricted Area 5 which they will have explored during their visit.

The tasks are designed to appeal to students in upper key stage 2 & 3.

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
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information located there, thus forming ideas for possible research after their visit. In particular, they need to consider questions about the dinosaurs for which they should like to know the answers.
